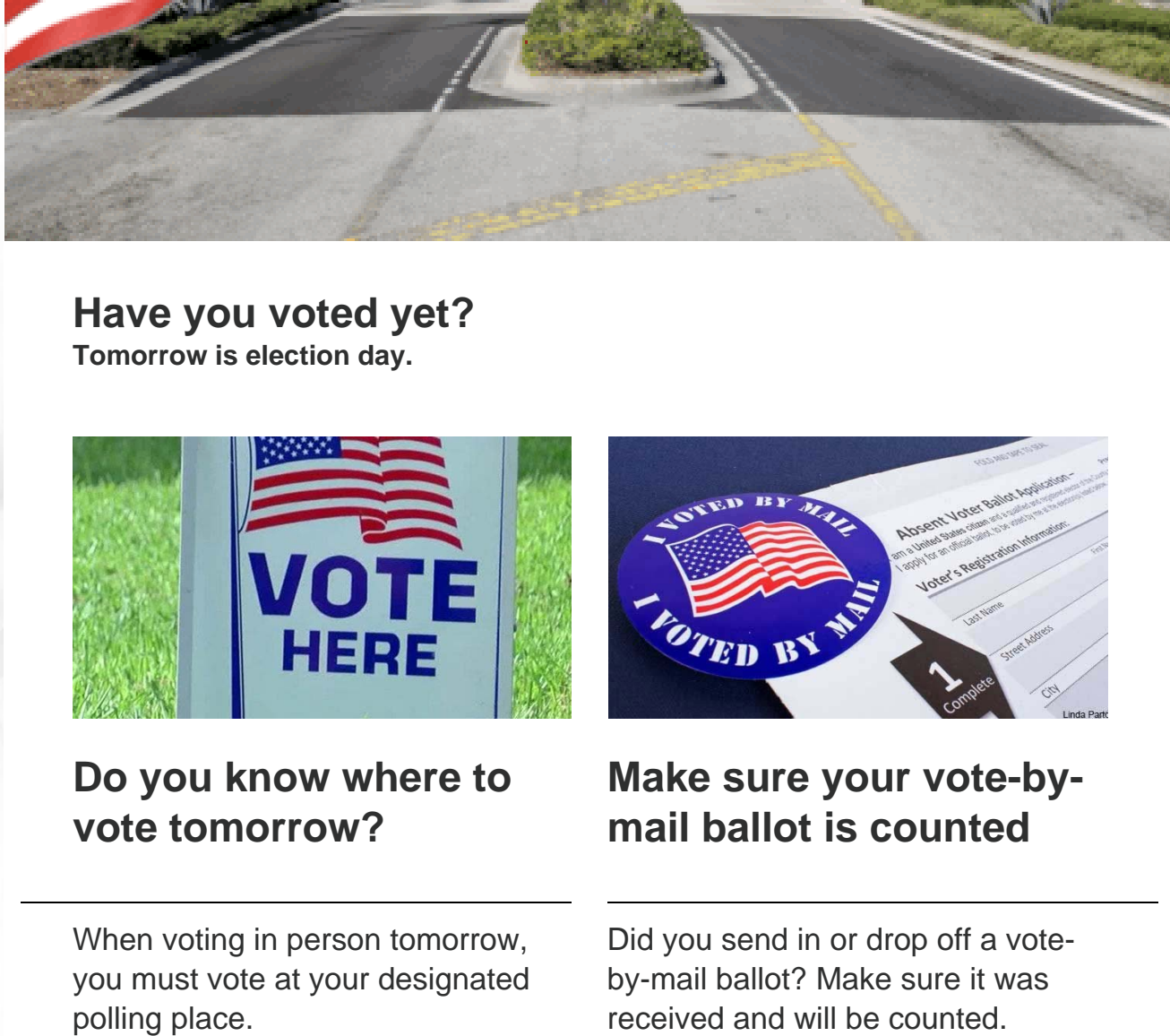

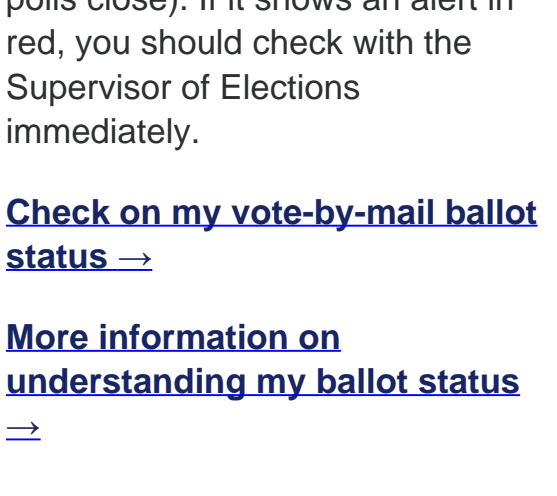
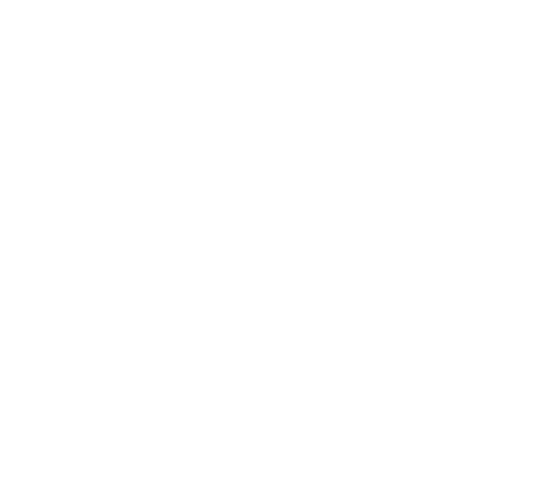

Have you voted yet?

Tomorrow is election day.



Do you know where to vote tomorrow?

Make sure your vote-by-mail ballot is counted

When voting in person tomorrow, you must vote at your designated polling place.

Did you send in or drop off a vote-by-mail ballot? Make sure it was received and will be counted.

To find your polling place, click below and enter your address.

You can check on the status of your mail-in ballot by clicking the link below. If your ballot status shows "Received" in blue, your ballot will be counted when the polls close. (It will not register as counted until the polls close). If it shows an alert in red, you should check with the Supervisor of Elections immediately.

DO NOT MAIL IN YOUR BALLOT!

If you still have a vote-by-mail ballot, have not voted yet, and do not want to vote in person at your polling place, you have only ONE option left.

You must drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at a Supervisor of Elections office by 7:00PM ELECTION NIGHT! It must be received by the time the polls close.



Where can I drop off my vote-by-mail ballot?

If you need to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot, below are two options. The closest location in Palm Beach Gardens is ONLY OPEN UNTIL 5:00PM. The main Supervisor of Elections office in West Palm Beach is open until 7:00PM.

Pet waste contains bacteria, parasites and spreads disease

When not properly disposed, it affects water quality and public health

When pet waste is disposed of improperly, not only water quality suffers, your health may be at risk, too. Pets, children who play outside, and adults who garden are most at risk for infection from some of the bacteria and parasites found in pet waste. Flies may also spread diseases from animal waste. Diseases or parasites that can be transmitted from pet waste to humans include:

Campylobacteriosis
A bacterial infection carried by dogs and cats that frequently causes diarrhea in humans.

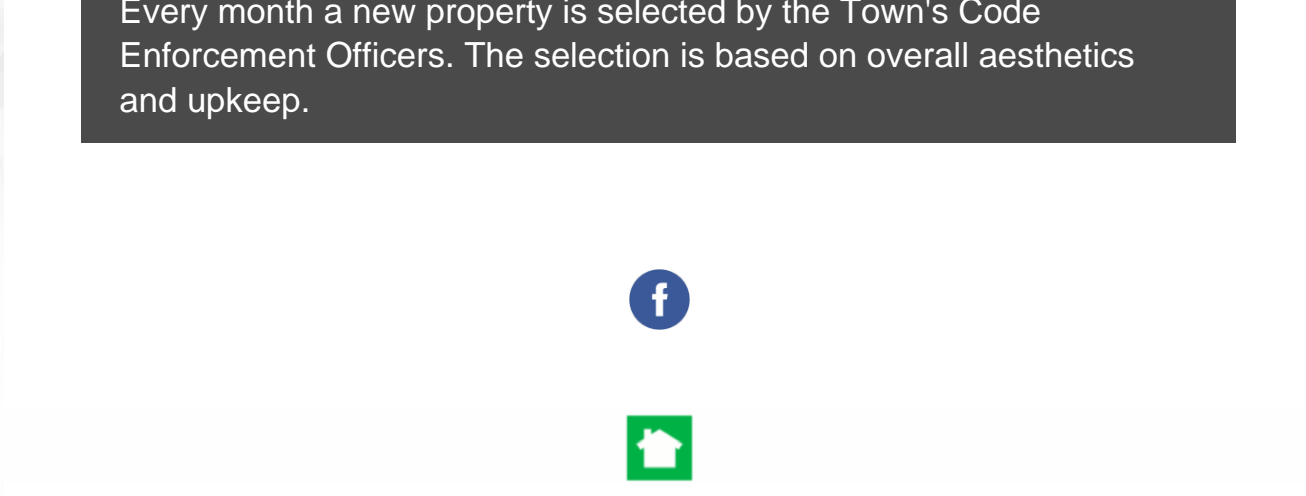
Cryptosporidium
A protozoan parasite carried by dogs, cats, mice, calves and many other mammals. Common symptoms include diarrhea, stomach cramps, nausea and dehydration. May be fatal to people with depressed immune systems.

Toxocariasis
Roundworms usually transmitted from dogs to humans, often without noticeable symptoms, but may cause vision loss, a rash, fever, or cough.

Toxoplasmosis
A protozoan parasite carried by cats that can cause birth defects such as mental retardation and blindness if a woman becomes infected during pregnancy; also a problem for people with depressed immune systems. Symptoms include headache, muscle aches, lymph node enlargement.

Pet waste may not be the largest or most toxic pollutant in urban waterways, but it is one of the many little sources of pollution that add up to a big problem.

In the Town of Lake Park, pet owners and caretakers are required to remove pet feces or excrement from public and private property and disposed of in a sanitary manner in order to protect our residents, as well as our waterways. It is also important to remember to wash your hands with soap and water immediately after disposing of your pet's waste.
