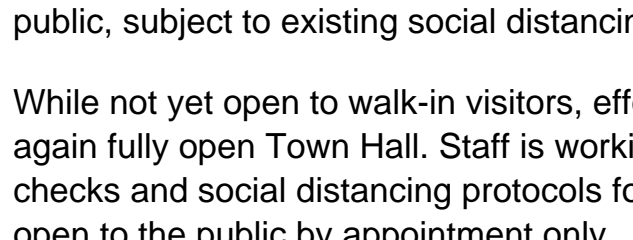

Lake Park Entering Phase Two

Here is what you need to know



Palm Beach County moving into Phase Two of reopening means several changes in Lake Park.

Playgrounds in Town parks are once again open to the public.

The Town Commission plans to resume convening in the Commission Chambers

beginning with the September 16 meeting. The meeting will be open to the public, subject to existing social distancing and face covering guidelines.

While not yet open to walk-in visitors, efforts are now underway to once again fully open Town Hall. Staff is working to implement temperature checks and social distancing protocols for visitors. For now, Town Hall is open to the public by appointment only.

The marina, library and public parks remain open, subject to CDC and local health guidelines. Please remember face coverings are required to be worn in all Town facilities.



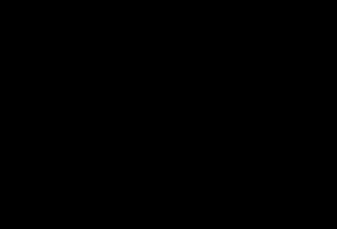
Town Leaders to Debate Next Year's Spending Plan

Public budget hearing set for September 14

The Lake Park Town Commission is scheduled to hold its first Budget Hearing on Monday, September 14 at 6:30pm. The meeting will be held remotely via Zoom.

The Budget Hearing is a great chance to learn about the Town's priorities and plans for the upcoming year. This will be the first of two budget meetings this month. The final approval of the budget takes place during the second meeting, scheduled for September 23 at 6:30pm.

The Town's fiscal year begins October 1.



Fill Out Your Census and Enter To Win a Gift Card

Lake Park residents who provide of a completed Census will be entered

Lake Park residents who provide the Town with proof that they completed the 2020 Census by September 30, 2020 will be entered into a drawing to win a gift card to a local business.

Every household in the United States is required to complete the Census every 10 years. This will be your last chance until 2030 to make a difference in the amount of federal funding the Town of Lake Park receives.

It's simple – the more households that complete the Census, the more money Lake Park gets from the federal government. This money is then used to help repair roads, support the local PBO and fire department stations, and fund Head Start and other educational programs in local schools. It even helps the Town respond to natural disasters, such as hurricanes.

If every household in Lake Park completes the Census, it can generate an additional \$13 million that can be used to improve the Town. The fewer households that respond, the less money the Town receives to serve its residents. It's that simple.

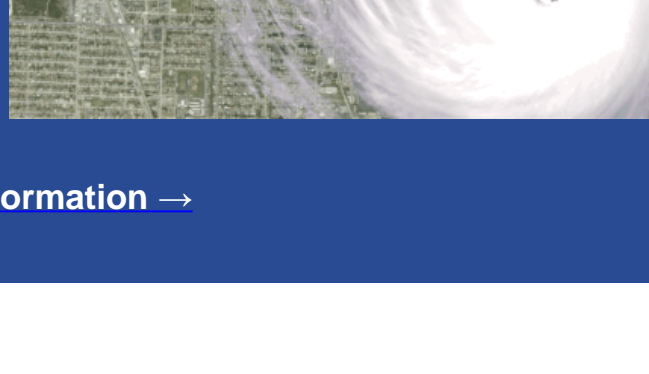

Protect Your Home From Flooding

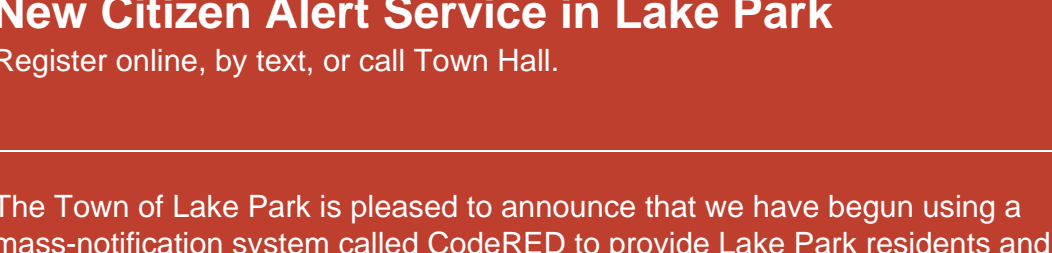
The Town of Lake Park participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), a federal program administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) that enables property owners to purchase insurance protection against flooding losses. Lake Park home and business owners are eligible to participate in NFIP and are eligible for a discount on flood insurance.
