





Temperatures inside a vehicle can reach 125° F within a matter of minutes. Because a child's body heats up three to five times faster than an adult's body, children are at a higher risk of suffering heatstroke, especially in an unattended car. When traveling with young children, Safe Kids Palm Beach County (a program of Community Partners of South Florida and funded by Children's

Services Council of Palm Beach County) offers the following tips:

• Never leave your child alone in a car under any circumstance. • Keep key fobs out of reach of children and lock the doors and trunk when the car isn't in use. • Create reminders to check the back seat when your destination is reached; place your purse or phone in the back seat, or place a child's item in the passenger seat to remind you the child is in the car. Walk around your vehicle every time you park and check inside the windows.

- Ask your childcare provider to contact you if your child does not show up. • If you ever see a child alone in a car, call 911 immediately.
- With these safety measures in mind, we can reduce the likelihood of a heatrelated tragedy.
