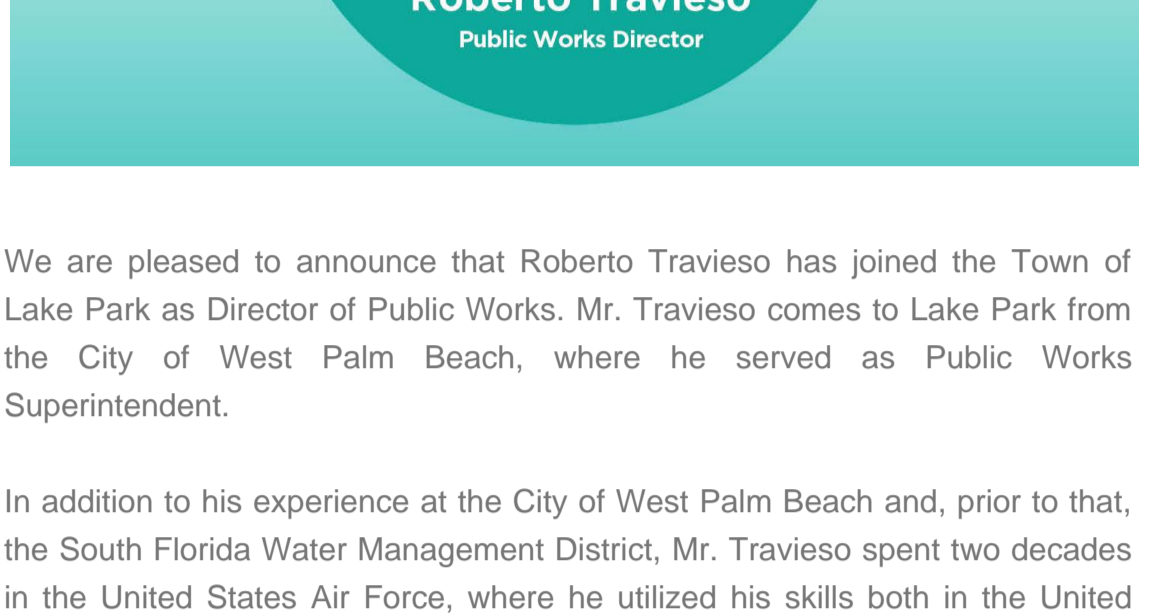

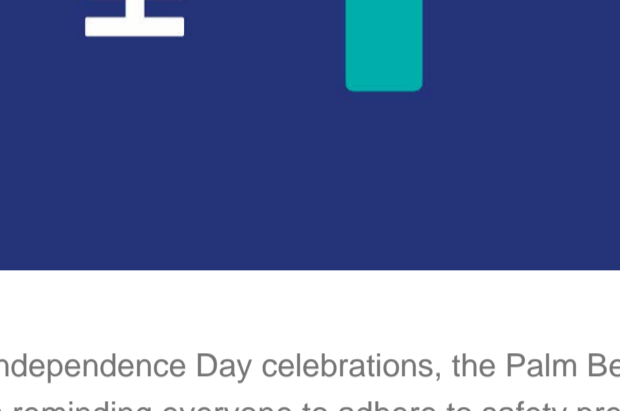

Secure online bill payments can now be made electronically on the Town's website. You may now pay your sanitation bill and permit fees, or apply for your business tax receipt, via credit/debit card or e-check online. It's never been easier! Payment by cash or check is accepted in person. Credit/debit transactions will have a service fee of 3% per transaction, with a minimum charge of \$2.00. ROBERTO TRAVIESO NAMED NEW PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR



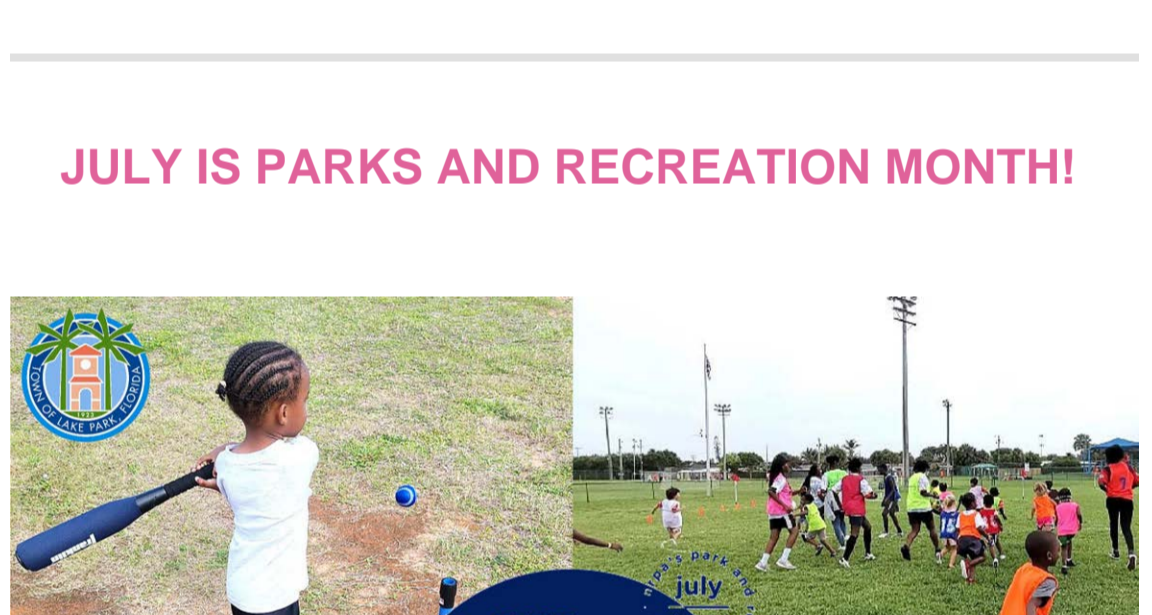

KEEP YOUR JULY 4TH CELEBRATIONS SAFE



As we plan our Independence Day celebrations, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is reminding everyone to adhere to safety precautions and avoid preventable injury or death.

Currently, per Florida State Law, the only days fireworks are allowed to be used without a permit are New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, and Independence Day. If you will be celebrating with fireworks this year, avoid restricted items, such as bottle rockets, roman candles, exploding fireworks, firecrackers, cherry bombs, M-80s, and aerial rockets with stands. Beware of any "waiver" offered, as it does not clear you of any responsibility or liability if you are caught using fireworks illegally. As a reminder, the act of using illegal fireworks carries a penalty of up to one year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

If you do plan to use any legal items this holiday, such as sparklers, novelties, and trick noisemakers, PBSO insists that you follow these important safeguards to celebrate safely:

- Use legal fireworks in an open area on a flat, hard surface.
- Be aware of the area in which fireworks may launch and any hazards presented in the area.
- Keep children and pets away, bearing in mind that these noises can frighten pets and livestock.
- Always light one item at a time and NEVER attempt to re-light a dud.
- Avoid "homemade" devices or those that have been altered.
- Have a fire extinguisher, hose, or bucket of water nearby for emergencies.



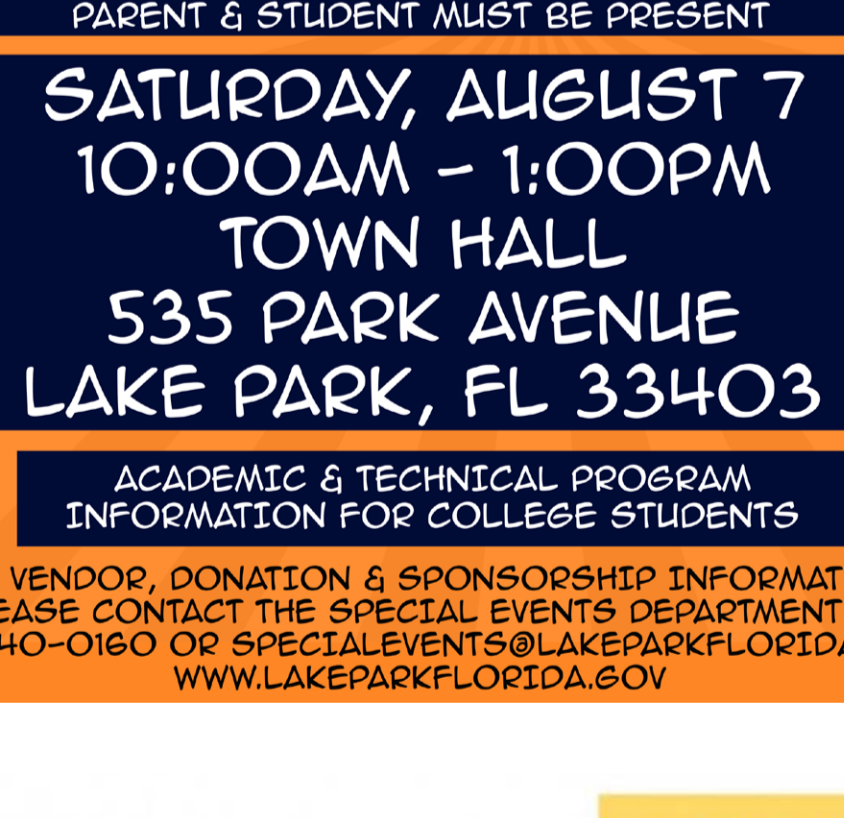

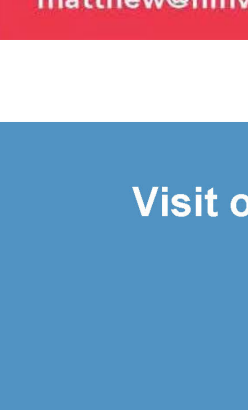
