

LAKE PARK CONSIDERING LATEST TREND IN AFFORDABLE HOUSING



This growing gap between income and cost of living is just one factor driving the Town of Lake Park to look at a new way to provide affordable housing. Lake Park has long prided itself on being an affordable-cost-of-living destination nestled in the heart of one of the nation's most expensive places to live.

As a result, the Town is now looking into changing zoning codes to allow Accessory Dwelling Units, or ADUs. An ADU is a second residential unit on a property that is separate from a main home. It can be an apartment located in a primary home or it can be a separate unit (attached to the main house or freestanding) on the property. Regardless of where it is located, an ADU must be a complete, self-contained residence that has places for sleeping, bathing,

and eating that are separate from the main home. A special web page has been created to provide additional information on ADUs. Please visit: www.LakeParkAccessoryDwellingUnits.com to learn more. ADUs can be rented to tenants seeking an affordable housing alternative to

traditional apartment units. The rent paid for an Accessory Dwelling Unit is often below the average market rate for an area. ADUs create an entirely new affordable housing option for individuals unable to afford full-sized rental

apartments or home purchases.

Accessory Dwelling Units also help homeowners by providing significant sources of additional income. If the ADU is leased to a tenant, the additional money can be used for mortgage payments on the property, utility payments, or any other financial obligations. In some cases, the income received from an ADU can be the difference between being able to afford to purchase the property or not being able to become a homeowner.

In addition, ADUs can be used to provide additional living space for extended

family, enabling multiple generations to live together.

There are already approximately 55 ADUs in Lake Park, all of which were built before current zoning codes were written. ADUs have not been permitted in recent years, but now the Town is considering changes to allow new ADUs to be built. On March 20, 2021 the Town will be holding resident workshops to provide more information on ADUs and asking for public feedback on the possibility of allowing them in Lake Park. There will be four 90-minute sessions throughout

the day (at 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM, 2:00 PM and 4:00 PM). If you would like to attend, please call 561-881-3320 by March 10 to RSVP. The Town wants to hear your ideas and opinions.

By providing accessible technology to the residents of Lake Park, we hope to make it easier for everyone to live, work and prosper in


our community.




