## TOWN MANAGER'S CONTRACT RECEIVES SIGNIFICANT EXTENSION

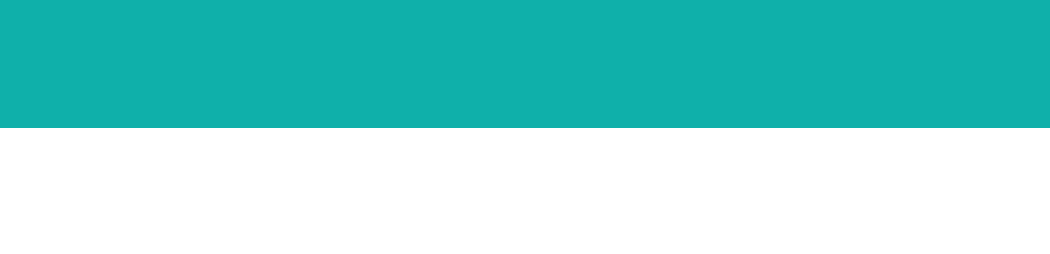


John D'Agostino became Lake Park's Town Manager six years ago, after a lengthy career in municipal government. Because of his extensive list of accomplishments and the expectation that he will continue to create growth and development in the Town, his contract was recently extended for an unprecedented five years.

His actions have garnered him support and admiration from employees, commissioners, colleagues in other municipalities and the public he is so dedicated to serving.

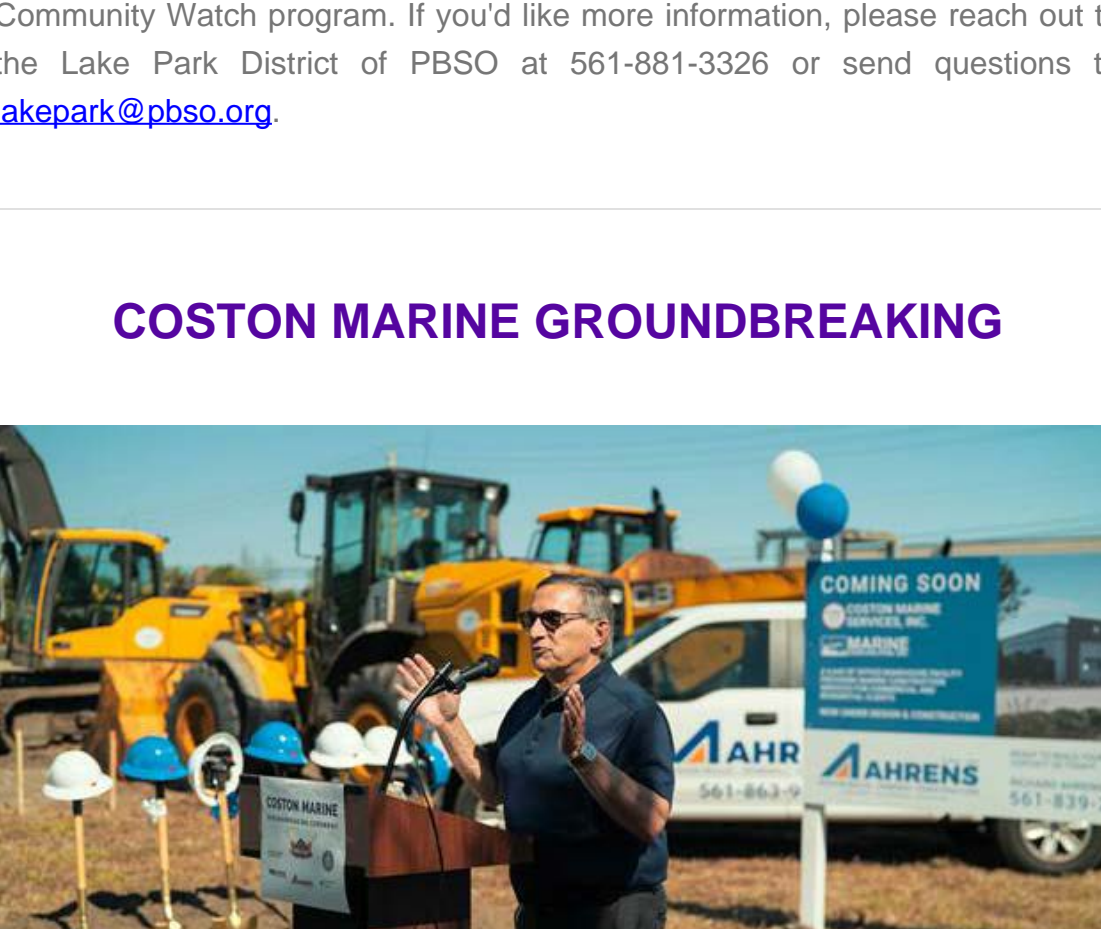
We look forward to the positive changes that we know Lake Park will experience under his leadership in the coming years.

## WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY WATCH PROGRAM?



The Community Watch program in Lake Park helps maintain Town safety and improves quality of life for our residents. But what exactly *is* the Community Watch program?

Community Watch is a group of Lake Park resident volunteers who work together with local law enforcement to reduce crime and suspicious activity throughout Lake Park by keeping an eye and ear out for trouble. Citizen participation is one of the most effective tools against crime. This program empowers residents to identify and report criminal activity, and implement effective home security measures through training provided by Palm Beach County Office's (PBSO) Crime Prevention Officers.

Lake Park's Community Watch program was started by local volunteers as a neighborhood safety measure, and PBSO took over leadership of the program in 2016 to link county and local efforts. PBSO hosts bi-monthly meetings during which a range of topics such as crime trends, current events and safety trainings are covered, and residents have the opportunity to ask questions, get advice and learn firsthand about the results of PBSO's efforts. Due to the pandemic, the meetings have been occurring virtually, but are expected to resume at the Lake Park Public Library in the coming months.

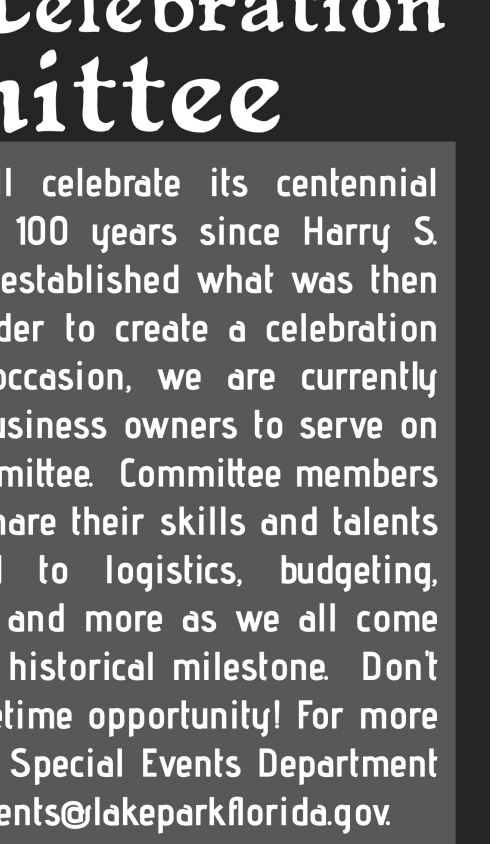
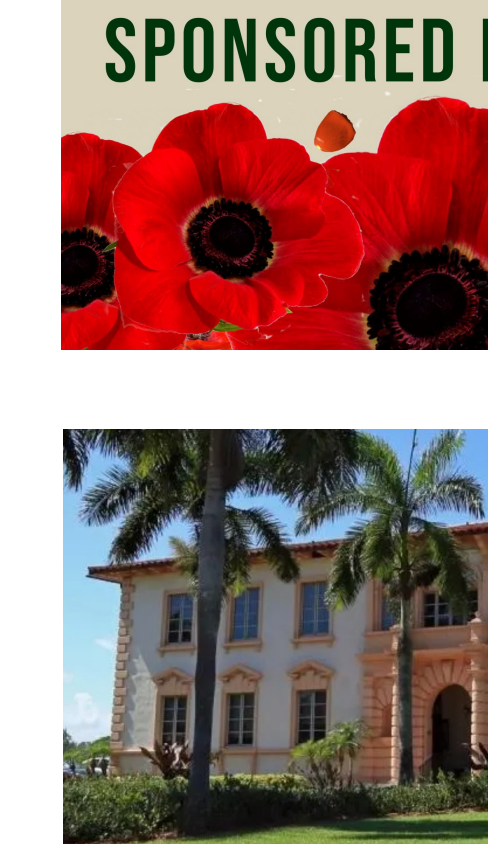
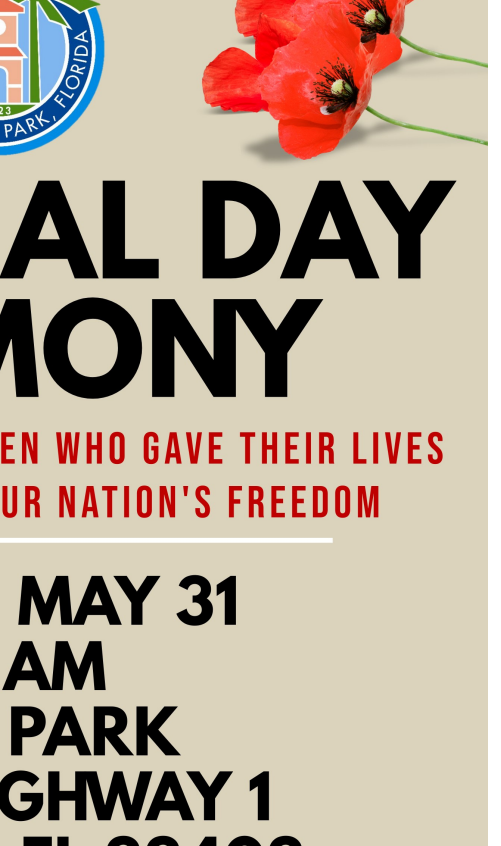
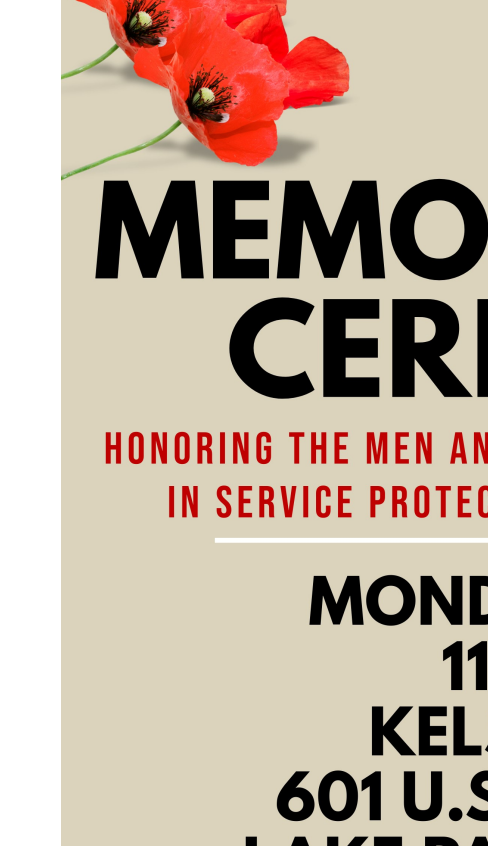

## COSTON MARINE GROUNDBREAKING

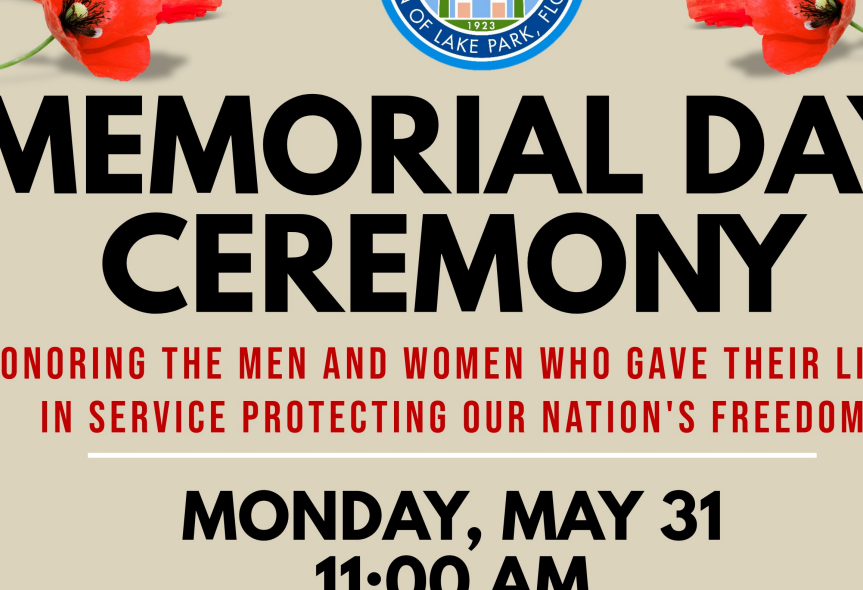
