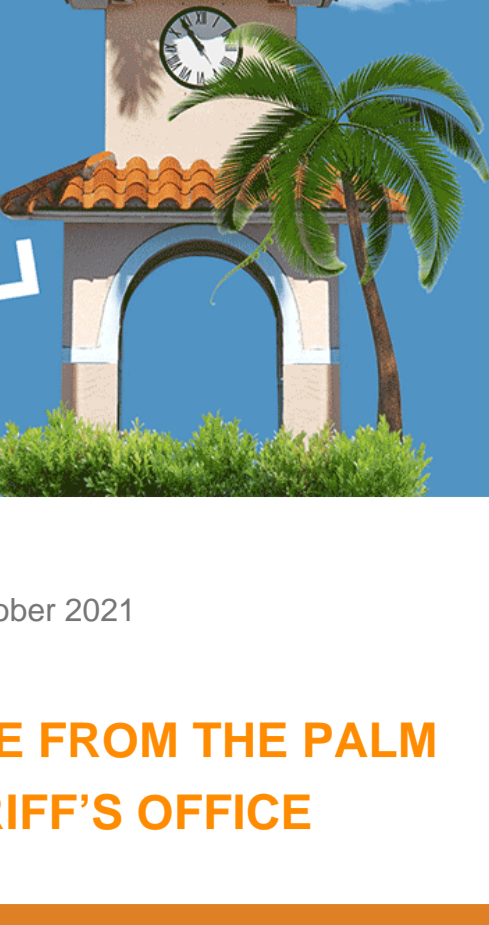
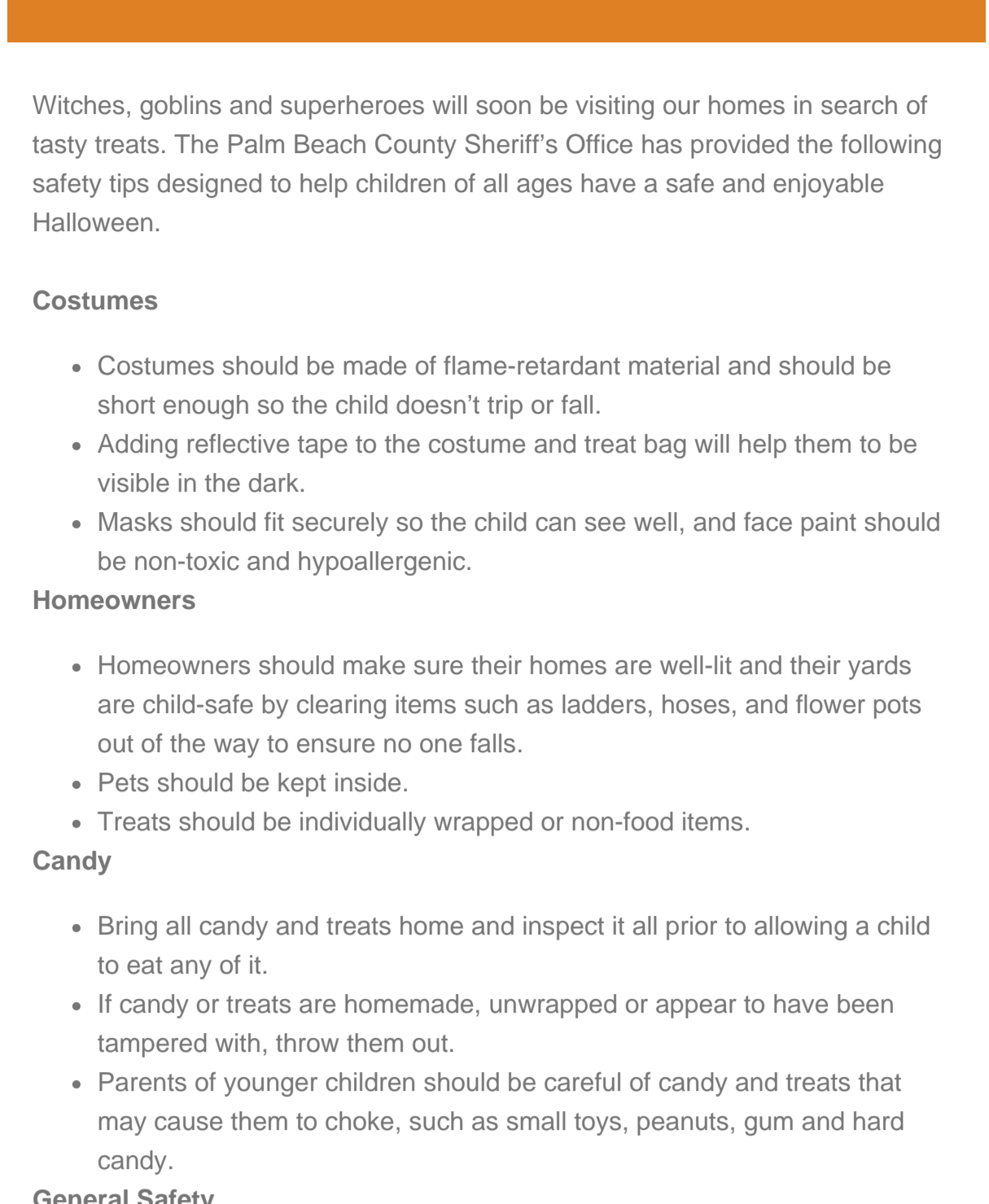

# HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Witches, goblins and superheroes will soon be visiting our homes in search of tasty treats. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has provided the following safety tips designed to help children of all ages have a safe and enjoyable Halloween.

### Costumes

- Costumes should be made of flame-retardant material and should be short enough so the child doesn't trip or fall.
- Adding reflective tape to the costume and treat bag will help them to be visible in the dark.
- Masks should fit securely so the child can see well, and face paint should be non-toxic and hypoallergenic.

### Homeowners

- Homeowners should make sure their homes are well-lit and their yards are child-safe by clearing items such as ladders, hoses, and flower pots out of the way to ensure no one falls.
- Pets should be kept inside.
- Treats should be individually wrapped or non-food items.

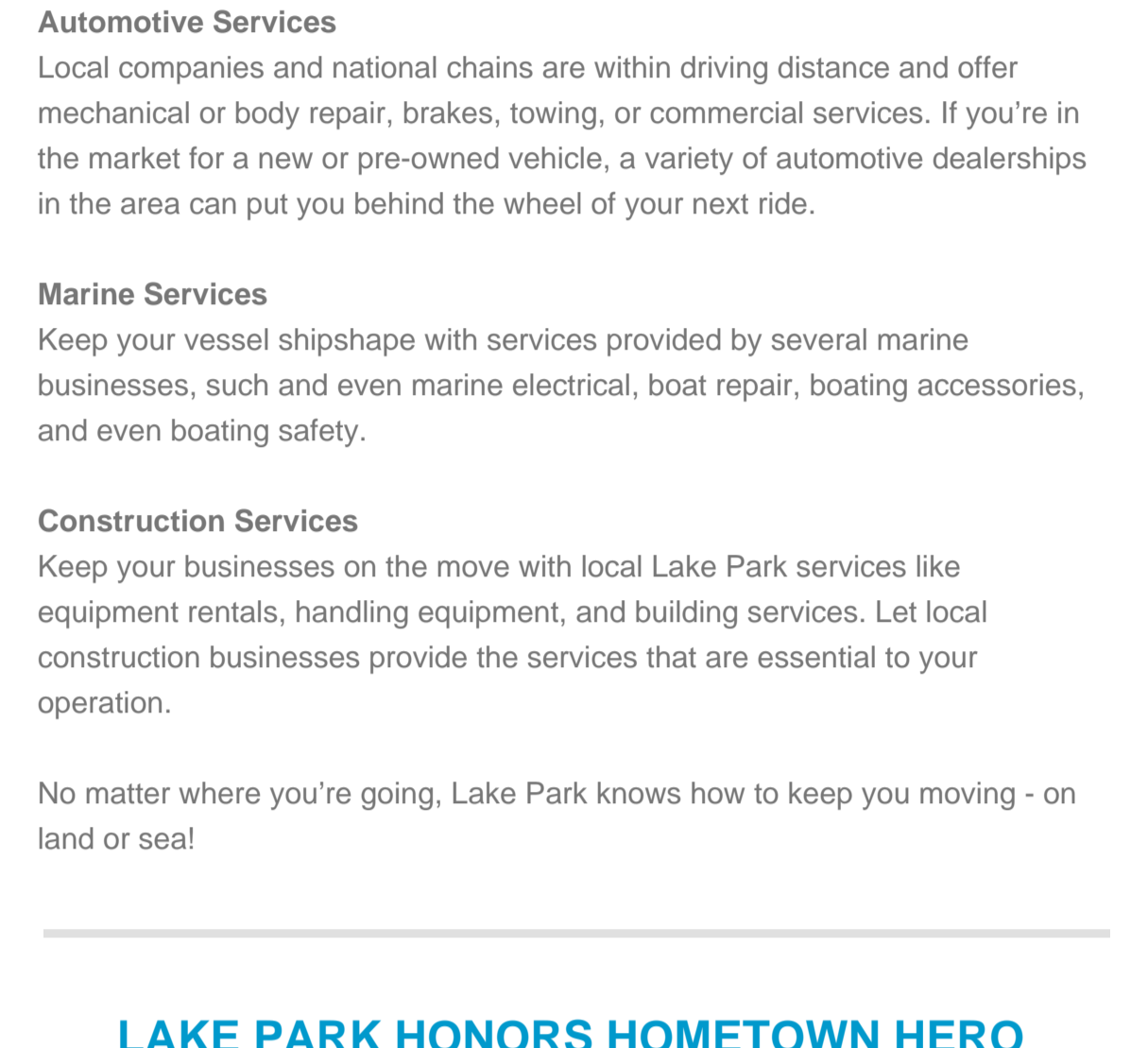
### Candy

- Bring all candy and treats home and inspect it all prior to allowing a child to eat any of it.
- If candy or treats are homemade, unwrapped or appear to have been tampered with, throw them out.
- Parents of younger children should be careful of candy and treats that may cause them to choke, such as small toys, peanuts, gum and hard candy.

### General Safety

- Children should be accompanied by an adult when trick-or-treating.
- Never go to a house that is dark.
- Do not take shortcuts through yards, driveways or alleys.
- Carry a flashlight when trick-or-treating at night.
- Obey traffic signals.
- Accept treats at the door and never go into a stranger's house.

### Marine Services

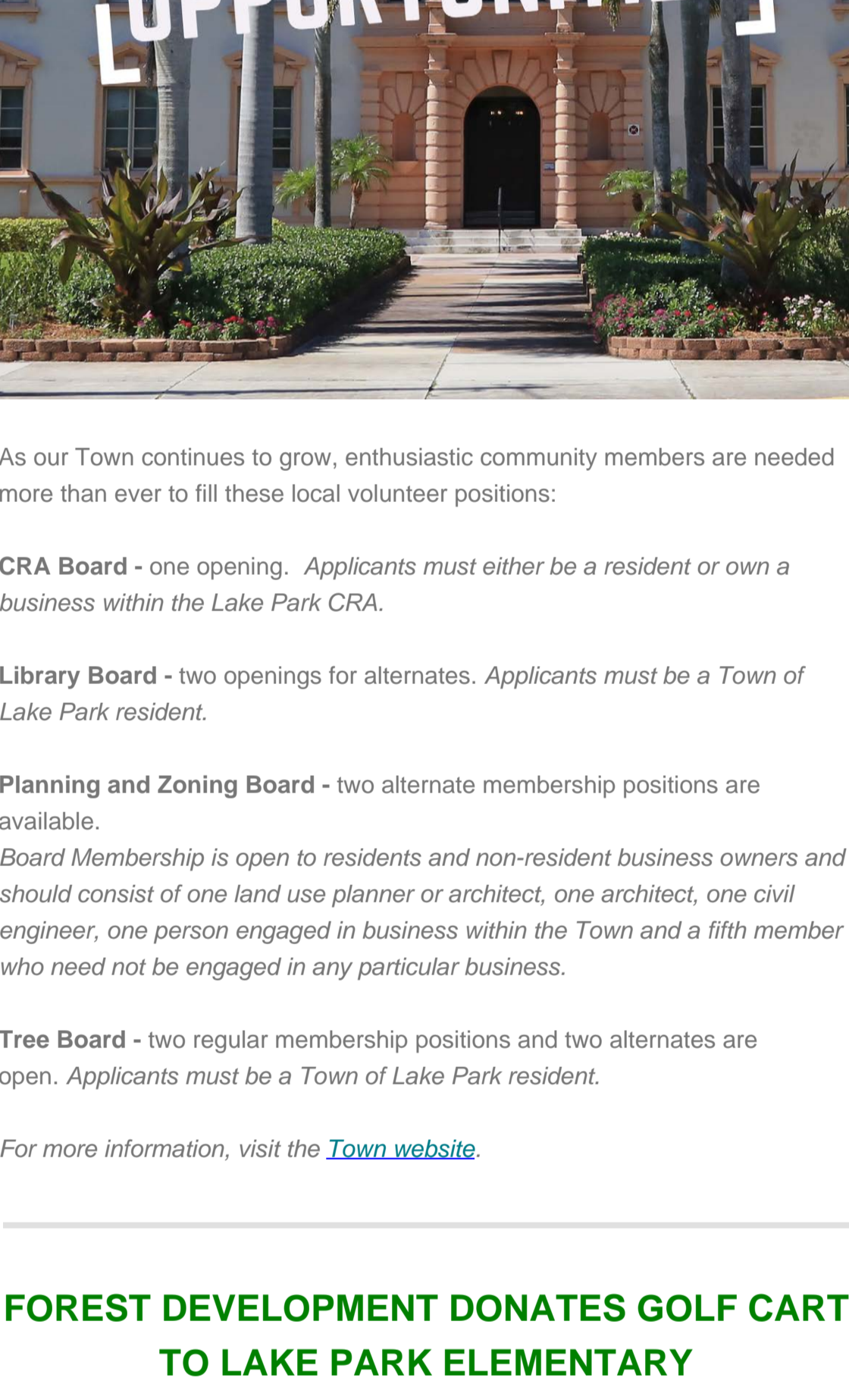
Keep your vessel shipshape with services provided by several marine businesses, such as even marine electrical, boat repair, boating accessories, and even boating safety.

**Tree Board** - two regular membership positions and two alternates are open. Applicants must be a Town of Lake Park resident.

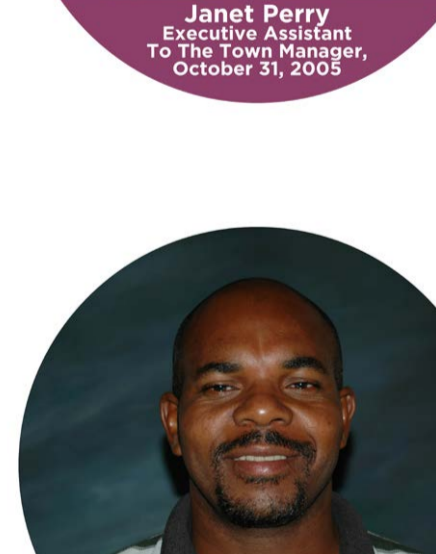

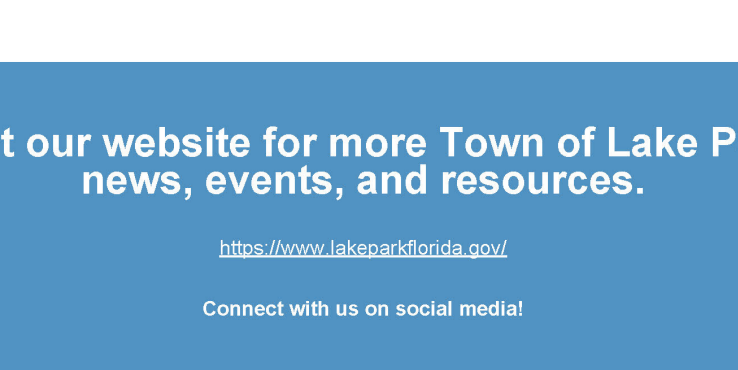
