

On March 22, we will see Mayor-Elect Roger Michaud inducted as Mayor of Lake Park. On that date he will become the first person of color to serve as this Town's Mayor, which is an important and well-deserved honor, and I know he will lead Lake Park with his head and his heart, just as he always has in his role

as Commissioner. We will also be inducting our newest Commissioner on March 22, but we will not know who that is until the evening of March 14, after all the votes have been counted. I encourage everyone to get out and vote for their favorite candidate. Voting information is available later in this newsletter for your convenience. I have enjoyed serving as Acting Mayor since the beginning of the year, just as I will enjoy returning to my role as Vice Mayor on March 23. There is currently one other woman who was elected to a Commission seat, and after the election there may be another (two of the three candidates are female). During March, which is Women's History Month, it is important to me to recognize the success of the strong, intelligent women in Lake Park. More than half of the department

directors on the Town staff, including Bambi McKibbon-Turner, our Assistant

Town Manager/Human Resources Director, are women. I am proud to work with them and applaud the success and growth they have created for Lake Park, which happens to be the home to many businesses that are owned by women.
