

Palm Beach County's Emergency Notification System

AlertPBC is Palm Beach County's Emergency Notification System. This free service allows anyone to receive notifications via phone calls, texts, emails and more about events (such as hurricanes) that are important to you and your family. Once you sign up, when Palm Beach County issues a notification

message using the method you requested. All information provided will be kept confidential. Currents can be be protected due to its natural floodplain functions, and to deceptive: six inches of moving water can knock you off

doors, low windows, and dryer vents. Construction of a small flood wall or earthen berm or redirecting drainage to keep water away from the building are examples of property protection. Electrical appliances, air conditioners, electrical panel boxes, and other appliances should be elevated above flood level. Search the Palm Beach County Public Library catalog for "flood" information. Remember, some flood protection measures may need a building permit and others may not be safe for your type of building, so be sure to talk to Community Development

before you make any alterations to your property. Town staff will provide advice and visit properties upon request to review a drainage problem and explain ways to help you protect your property from flood damage. Contact the Community Development Department at 561-881-3319 for more information about this free service. Flood Warning In the event of an oncoming storm or flood emergency, tune into the Town's TV Channel 18 (Comcast customers) since it may be used to provide information, but most importantly, a CodeRED message will be delivered to all residents by phone (please email the Town at publicinformation@lakeparkflorida.gov if you believe the Town may not have your phone number). It will provide upto-date information pertaining specifically to Lake Park. You

your feet. If you must walk in water, use a pole or stick to see how deep the water is. > Do not drive through flooded areas! Don't drive around Check your building for water entry points, such as road barriers. Canals or ponds may not be distinguishable from roads. Driving though flooded streets can produce a wake that worsens flooding to buildings along the street. Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. Electrical current can travel through water. > Be Prepared! Have an evacuation and shelter route planned before an evacuation order is issued. Do not wait until the last minute. Go to the Palm Beach County Emergency Management website pbcgov.com/knowurzone for valuable information.

Purchase a Flood Insurance Policy Today! The Town of Lake

Park participates in the National Flood Insurance Program

(NFIP), a federal program that allows property owners and

renters to purchase flood insurance for their building and/or

its contents. There is a 30-day waiting period before


