

• Only approach well-lit homes where porch or exterior lights are on. • Watch for vehicles. Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers. Avoid shortcuts through back yards, alleys or parks.

• Keep doors locked, even if you are in front of your home handing out candy.

• A great way to ensure the safety of trick-or-treaters is to attend public, organized events such as the Sunset Celebration Fall Festival and Halloween festivities at malls, churches or local businesses. • Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose


• Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.




