By conducting regular traffic stops, law enforcement officers can identify and apprehend individuals who may be involved in criminal activities such as drug trafficking, weapon possession, or driving under the influence. Additionally, traffic stops help deter potential criminals and assist with speed enforcement, making the Town safer for everyone.

The Town is proud to shine a spotlight on the commendable efforts of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office District 10 for their unwavering commitment to keeping our community safe. Between the years of 2021 and 2023, they performed close to 8,500 traffic stops within our 2.4-square-mile Town, demonstrating their dedication to ensuring the security and well-being of the Town of Lake Park.

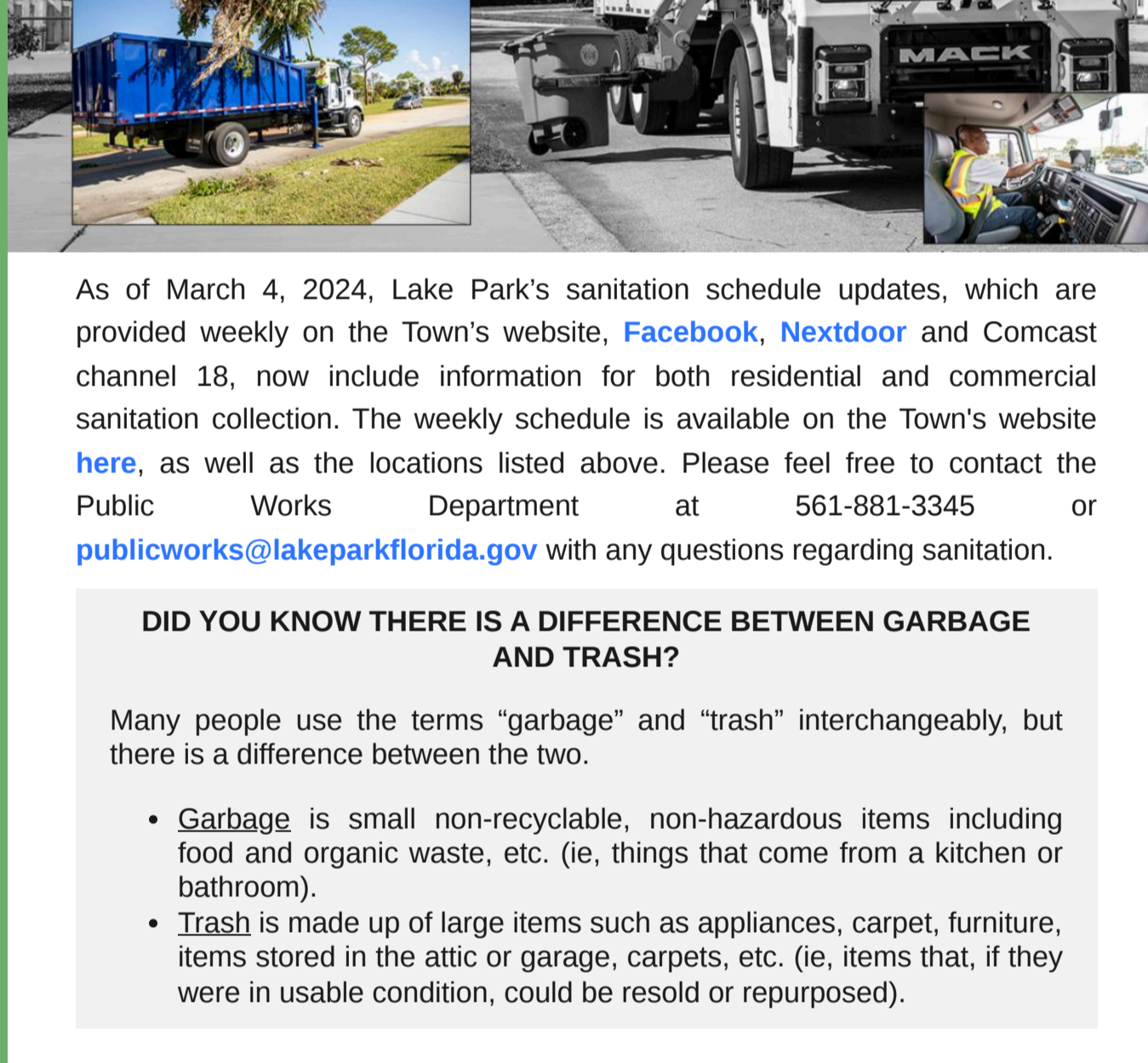

DID YOU KNOW THERE IS A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN GARBAGE AND TRASH?

Many people use the terms "garbage" and "trash" interchangeably, but there is a difference between the two.

- Garbage is small non-recyclable, non-hazardous items including food and organic waste, etc. (ie, things that come from a kitchen or bathroom).
- Trash is made up of large items such as appliances, carpet, furniture, items stored in the attic or garage, carpets, etc. (ie, items that, if they were in usable condition, could be resold or repurposed).

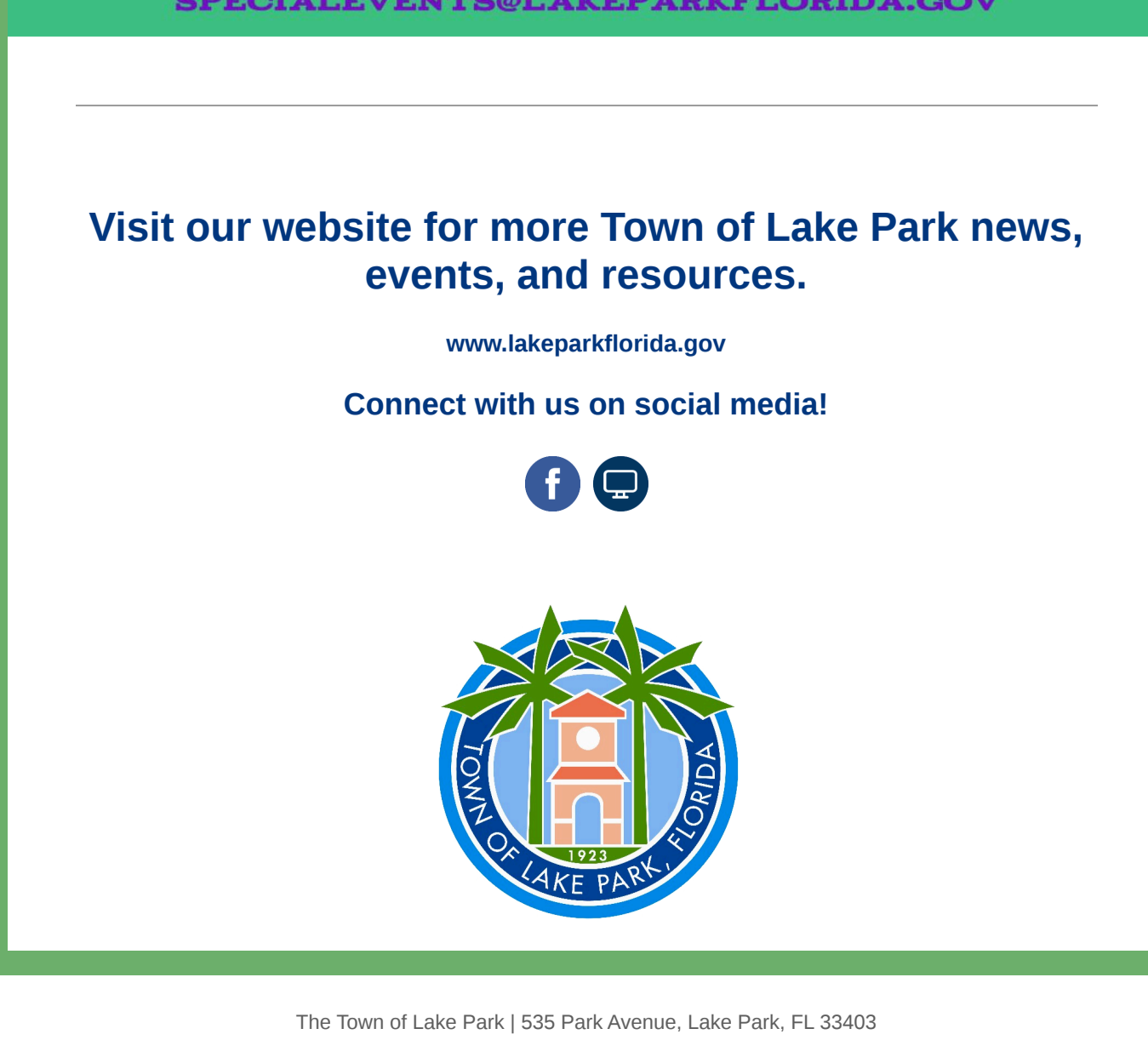
