

Minutes Town of Lake Park, Florida Joint Workshop Town Commission and Planning & Zoning Board Wednesday, December 4, 2019, 6:00 p.m. Town Commission Chamber, 535 Park Avenue

The Town Commission met for the purpose of a Joint Workshop with the Planning & Zoning Board on Wednesday, December 4, 2019 at 6:10 p.m. Present were Mayor Michael O'Rourke, Vice-Mayor Kimberly Glas-Castro, Commissioners Erin Flaherty, John Linden, Roger Michaud, Town Manager John O. D'Agostino, Attorney Thomas Baird, and Town Clerk Vivian Mendez. Planning & Zoning Board Members Joseph Rice, Charlemagne Metayer (arrived at 6:11 p.m.) and Vice-Chair Martin Schneider were present. Planning & Zoning Board Members Larry Malanga and Chair Judith Thomas were absent.

Town Clerk Mendez performed the roll call and Mayor O'Rourke led the pledge of allegiance.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Discussion on the Twin Cities Mall Site (C-3 Regional Business District) led by Dover Kohl & Partners

Jason King, Dover Kohl & Partners, presented to the Town Commission and Planning & Zoning Board (see Exhibit "A").

The Town Commission and Planning & Zoning Board recessed to participate in focus groups. Thereafter, the groups paraphrased their discussions and presented their findings.

- Group 1: Commissioner Michaud reported that his group discussed family friendly initiatives, aesthetics, and active areas (coffee shop, gym, walkable).
- Group 2: Commissioner Flaherty reported that his group discussed residential entrances, parking initiatives, walkable areas (trails, small parks), three-story development with gradual increases, mixed-use, and entertainment amenities (movie theatre/ bowling).
- Group 3: Commissioner Linden reported that his group discussed green space, outdoor amphitheater, relocation of Publix for the creation of a parking garage, and trolley services that travel to Park Avenue.
- Group 4: Mayor O'Rourke reported that his group discussed a central attraction (art, entertainment, and retail), height specifications, gym, and a transportation hub (uber/lyft, scooters).

Mr. King explained that Dover, Kohl & Partners would create an illustrative plan inclusive of the ideas presented. He thanked everyone for their participation.

NORTHLAKE PROMENADE VILLAGE SHOPPES




TREASURE COAST REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL PLAN



WINTER SPRINGS TOWN CENTER (OUTSIDE ORLANDO)
















WHAT IS A FORM-BASED CODE?





Conventional Zoning: ...ignores street patterns ...includes street patterns Typical Subdivision Cul-de-Sacs Contrasts with conventional zoning




Conventional Zoning:


Conventional Zoning: ...mostly text

Sec. 45-36. - General provisions.

The provisions of this article shall be subject to the following provisions and exceptions:

- A. Chimneys, water tanks, radio or television towers, telecommunications antenna/towers, church spires, elevator lofts, flagpoles and parapet walls may be erected above the height limits herein established.
 - A-1. No addition to any building and no structure or object shall be erected, placed or maintained or built to a height which exceeds four (4) stories or sixty (60) feet where any portion of said building or of the property upon which it is located is within five hundred feet of any R-1, single-family dwelling district.
- 3. Swimming pools shall be set back at least seven and one-half (7½) feet from the back property line measured from the rim of the pool and not less than five (5) feet from the side property line including the two-and-one-half-foot walk around the pool. The highest projection of the swimming pool shall not exceed two (2) feet. Outdoor
