**PROCLAMATION  
IN HONOR OF THE 80<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY AND REDEDICATION  
OF  
LAKE PARK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

*WHEREAS;* Lake Park Elementary School was constructed in 1923 as the first concrete school building in the Palm Beaches; and

*WHEREAS;* Lake Park Elementary School grew from a two-room school house to include additional classrooms and a gymnasium; and

*WHEREAS;* Lake Park Elementary School survived the Hurricane of 1928 and served as a shelter for many local Kelsey City residents; and

*WHEREAS;* Lake Park Elementary School continued to serve as the heart of the original Kelsey City and the locale for many social activities, and continues to this day to function as a vital community asset; and

*WHEREAS;* because of its Mission style of architecture and historic significance, the Lake Park Elementary School and its Gymnasium were designated by the Town of Lake Park as a locally significant site on August 31, 1998; and

*WHEREAS;* on the occasion of the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Lake Park Elementary School and the rededication of its newly renovated facilities, the Town Commission of the Town of Lake Park wishes to publicly recognize Lake Park Elementary School and its teachers and staff for the contributions which they have made in educating the youth of our community;

*NOW, THEREFORE,* on behalf of the Commission of the Town of Lake Park, I, Paul W. Castro, Mayor of the Town of Lake Park, Florida, do hereby extend the gratitude of the Town of Lake Park and congratulations to the Lake Park Elementary School upon the occasion of its 80<sup>th</sup> birthday and rededication.
