ORDINANCE 01-2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COMMISSION OF THE TOWN OF LAKE PARK, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING A COMPREHENSIVE CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, The Town of Lake Park, Florida (Town) is a duly constituted municipality having such power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes: and

WHEREAS, the Town Commission wishes to adopt a comprehensive non-discrimination statement to demonstrate, as a matter of public policy, that the Town opposes discrimination based on race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, gender, gender identity or expression, marital status, veteran's status, age, national 17 origin, disability, pregnancy, familial status, sexual orientation and genetic information; and

WHEREAS, so that the Town could avoid the substantial expense of defending itself from additional erroneous claims of discrimination by the Palm Beach County Office of Equal Opportunity through the adoption of Resolution 47-08-18, the Town Commission opted out of Chapter 15, Article III of the Palm Beach County Code; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's decision to "opt out" of Chapter 15, Article III, was predicated upon the County's erroneous claims that the Town was discriminating against certain individuals who sought housing in Sober Homes based on the definition of the term "family" in the Town Code and the County's incorrect and inappropriate application of this definition of the "family" to claims of discrimination in housing within the Town; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is intended to provide all persons in the Town with the same protections afforded by Article III of Chapter 15 the Palm Beach County Code of Ordinances,

provided however that the Town's definition of the term "family" shall prevail over the County's definition of the term "family"; and

WHEREAS, through the adoption of this ordinance, any person in the Town who has been the subject to discrimination may pursue a claim through the County's Office of Equal Opportunity as set forth in Article III of Chapter 15 of the County's Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKE PARK, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1</u>. The whereas clauses are true and correct and shall constitute the legislative findings of the Town Commission.

Section 2. The Town Commission hereby adopts this ordinance as its "Civil Rights Policy," providing as follows.

- (a) Purpose. The Town Commission of Lake Park desires to secure for its citizens freedom from discrimination because of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, gender, gender identity or expression, marital status, veteran's status, age, national origin, disability, pregnancy, familial status, sexual orientation and genetic information, and thereby protect their interest in personal dignity; preserve the public safety, health and general welfare; and promote the interests, rights and privileges of individuals within the Town. The Town Commission also desires to adopt an ordinance that is consistent with federal, state and local laws and affords its citizens access to remedies in the case of alleged discrimination namely, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the Florida Commission on Human Relations and the Palm Beach County Office of Equal Opportunity.
- (b) Adoption of the Town of Lake Park Civil Rights Act. The Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992, Chapter 760. Section 760.01 through 760.11 and Section 509.092; Florida's Fair Housing Act, Chapter 760, Section 760.20 through 760.37; the Palm Beach County Equal Employment Ordinance, Chapter 2, Article VI, Division 1, Sections 2-251 through 2-313; and the Palm Beach County Ordinance for Equal Opportunity to Housing and Places of Public Accommodation, Chapter 15, Article Ill, Sections 15-36 through 15-67 with the exception of the County Code's definition of the term "family" as set forth in Section 15-37(7) therein, are collectively adopted by reference by the Town Commission as the Town's Civil Rights Act.
- **Section 3**. The provisions of Article III of Chapter 15 of the Palm Beach County Code of Ordinances are adopted by the Town and may be enforced by the County's Office of Equal

Opportunity, with the exception that the Office of Equal Opportunity is required to apply the definition of the term "family" as contained in Chapter 78, Article I, § 78-2 of the Town Code and is prohibited from applying the definition of the term "family" in County Code § 15-27 (7) within the municipal limits of the Town of Lake Park.

Section 4. Severability.

If any section, phrase, sentence or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 5. Repeal of Laws in Conflict.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Town of Lake Park, Florida, which are in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
