Library Director's Report:

2. Presentation of Library Director's Report.

Library Director Mahnk gave a presentation on the Director's Report (see Exhibit "A"). Chair Lawrence asked what age group uses the Teen Room. Library Director Mahnk stated between the ages of 10-12-years old. She explained that the Library was seeking volunteers to assist patrons with computers. She made a correction to the last bullet point indicating that Guaridan Credit Union presented Improve Your Life with Better Money Management.

Librarian II Cooper explained the programs at the Library. She stated that Bow Wow Tails begins on May 18, 2019 and children will read to the dogs for 15-minutes. Two special guest will speak during the summer.

4. Presentation and preview of the 2019 Summer Reading Program and Overview of current library programs by Libraian, Judith Cooper and Youth Services Assistant, Ileana Bell.

Youth Services Assistant Ileana Bell gave a presentation regarding the Children's Department (see Exhibit "B"). Chair Lawrence asked what types of books the children are reading. Ms. Bell explained that they are reading anything that are on their level or above. She explained that they have a system called Whisper Phones in which the children are able to read outloud into the Whisper Phones and they are able to hear themselves without disturbing the other readers in the room. It has shown that students that read outloud improve their reading skills.

Chair Lawrence asked if after some of the special guest come to the Library this summer, will the Library stock books on the topics the speakers discussed. Youth Services Assistant Bell stated that they have begun to showcase the types of books that speakers will discuss as well as topics that she has been discussing with the children.

Chair Lawrence shared some suggestions on books to have for the Teen Room. She suggested self-esteem books, drug prevention, and dealing with peer pressure. She also suggested using alterted-books and turning them into journals. She offered to come to the Library and show staff how it was done. She stated that they use this menthod at one of her schools. Library Director Mahnk took Chair Lawrence up on her offer to show staff how to turn books into alter-books and then into journals.

Board Member Shelton asked how the Library Budget was doing. Library Director Mahnk stated that they are working through the budget and making improvements to the Library.

DIVISION 2. - LIBRARY BOARD Modified

• Sec. 2-151. - Established.

There is hereby established a library board for the town.

(Ord. No. 5-1968, § I, 4-15-1968; Code 1978, § 12-16)

Sec. 2-152. - Composition.

The library board shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the town commission.

(Ord. No. 5-1968, § I, 4-15-1968; Code 1978, § 12-17)

• Sec. 2-153. - Qualifications.

Members of the library board shall be residents of the town; however, neither the mayor nor any member of the town commission shall be eligible to be a member of the library board.

(Ord. No. 5-1968, § II, 4-15-1968; Code 1978, § 12-18)

Sec. 2-154. - Term of members.

Members of the library board shall be appointed for a term of three years or until their successors have been appointed and qualified.

(Ord. No. 5-1968, § I, 4-15-1968; Code 1978, § 12-19; Ord. No. 05-2010, § 2, 6-2-2010)

Sec. 2-155. - Removal of members.

Members of the library board may be removed by an affirmative vote of a majority of the total members of the town commission.

(Ord. No. 5-1968, § VI, 4-15-1968; Code 1978, § 12-20)

Sec. 2-156. - Vacancies.

In the case of vacancy on the library board by resignation, removal or otherwise, the town commission shall fill such vacancy for the unexpired term.

One of the activities we're most proud of in the Children's room is the section we've developed called: Taste the Rainbow This is a section where parents, teachers, tutors, or children can go to get exactly what they need

This section combines the school's current reading system (letters A-Z) with Lexile levels, and grade level books that are best for the child. (see most pictures above)

Now each student can know with confidence that they are reading at or above their grade/letter/Lexile level.

This new design has made things just a bit more simplified for everyone who's trying to improve children's reading!

Pizza-ZZ!

Another activity that has been a great success this year is our Reading With Pizzazz contest!

We set a goal for the children to read 300 books before May 31** (last day of school); this was a team and individual contest, every 5 books a student reads will earn them a prize, as well as getting them that much closer to the Pizza Party planned at activity's end!

We have already reached that goal in the 3rd week of April!

Now they read for "extras" at their party such as: extra toppings on the pizzas, and cupcakes, and maybe even ice cream party! Thus, we've implemented "extension goals".

Because we whisper in the Library

After reviewing this concept, we opted to "give it a go".

Whisper Phones is what they're called

The concept is a simple one: the child grabs their book, takes a "phone", and is able to read aloud (which they ALL seem to do, even the older ones still).

You'il see the Reading Logs we have on hand new as well, for those who want to log their time, books, and keep track of their reading progress in general.


